WHAT ARE THESE WORKSHOPS FOR?


- A non-statutory, but important, stage of consultation and engagement
- A genuine opportunity to feed into the masterplan when it is still in very early stages of development
- A chance to tell us about the challenges and to explore the opportunities
- In parallel we are engaging with a range of technical stakeholders from local authorities and other specialist groups – including BBOWT, Natural England and the Environment Agency
- We are also working with a Design Review Panel who will assess our work
- This is not a planning application we do not have all the answers and there is still a long way to go
- Our final event in this series will be an opportunity to comment on an initial masterplan
- There will be a full programme of public consultation before we submit any application

FUTURE WORKSHOPS

- Tuesday 2 February, 6-8.30pm: Masterplan issues and constraints including environmental, transport and infrastructure, water management, heritage and utilities
- Thursday 4 February, 6-8.30pm: Putting the site in context focus on the masterplan
 including the types and densities of homes, green infrastructure, Sydlings Copse SSSI,
 connectivity and the protection/enhancement of Bayswater Brook
- **Monday 8 February, 6-8.30pm:** Community uses existing uses and gaps in local provision, Wick Farm, sports facilities, integration with existing communities and key employment sites, supporting non-car travel, long term management
- **Wednesday 10 February, 6-7.30pm:** Understanding, working with and supporting Barton aimed primarily at Barton residents
- Tuesday 9 March, 6-7.30pm: Presentation of revised and updated masterplan and opportunities for further discussion and feedback






